OUR PARISH NEWS

OFFICE CLOSED ON MONDAYS

The office will be closed on Mondays from **July 2nd to September 3rd** inclusive.

FOOD BANK DONATIONS

The storage rooms at the Centretown Emergency Food Centre are empty as they have used up their accumulated stores, and are not receiving donations in any significant amount. This means they are purchasing a larger portion of food than normal. We encourage you to contribute food over the summer months to help fill their cupboards so they can better serve the community.

NATURAL GAS USAGE AND CHARGES

This past heating year (from June 2017 to May 2018 bills) saw a 9% increase in the total natural gas usage by our Parish, while temperatures were 8% colder in terms of heating-degree-days according to Environment Canada. The average gas rates have increased by 1.4% over last year, which when combined with our increase in usage, led to **an 11% increase in natural gas charges**

for the Parish Centre and Church buildings in 2017-18.
