VOCATION REFLECTION

"(In) Whose Image?"

In Matthew's Gospel, the Pharisees and Herodians try to
set a trap for Jesus. In doing so, and using Roman coinage,
they end up entrapping themselves. The coin that they
presented had the effigy of Caesar and bore the inscription
"Tiberius Caesar, Son of the Divine Augustus" and the
Law forbade the use of images, especially those that could
be interpreted as images of the divine. As always, Jesus'
response has many layers of meaning. In asking whose
image is on the coin, Jesus uses the term from Genesis,
which describes humans as created in the image of God. In
reality, his question challenges his opponents to declare
their loyalty, their faith. Are they loyal to God, in whose
image they are created, or are they loyal to Rome and the
Emperor, whose coins they carry.

In the Gospel account, we perceive this change in the disciples through a few revealing images: their hearts burned within them as they heard the Scriptures explained by Jesus, their eyes were opened as they recognized him and, ultimately, their feet set out on the way.
