4. Business arising:

4.1 Laudato Si' - McE Galbreath

Care for Creation, 7-year plan.

Proposal: Using *Laudato Si'* as an umbrella for all our committees/ministries

The following identifies the 8 aspects of the *Laudato Si'* mission and suggests which of the current Canadian Martyrs ministries/committees we feel could be instrumental in moving us forward:

- 1. Response to the Cry of the Earth: Development & Peace
- 2. Response to the Cry of the Poor: Pastoral Care (seniors) and the Settlement Committee (refugee settlement)
- 3. Simple Lifestyles: Development & Peace
- 4. Ecological Education: Youth Group
- 5. Ecological Economics: Faith Formation (to generate a speaker to help us understand a way forward)
- 6. Ecological Spirituality: Liturgy Committee and Faith Formation (to generate a speaker to help us understand a way forward)
- 7. Reconciliation: Truth and Reconciliation Committee and related resources (i.e., LTIV)
- 8. Community Engagement and Participatory Action: Synodal Committee and PPC

It is the Archdiocese's request that each parish within the Archdiocese work on a Care for Creation Seven Year Plan, as a concrete response to Laudato Si. Each September, the parish will put forward our plan for the year ahead and in May or June, we will report how it has gone. At the recent Lunch and Learn, several parishioners watched The Letter. We could go out to these parishioners for their thoughts. We could also promote this movie again; show it after Mass, after pizza night or have a movie night. Faith Formation Committee will look for several speakers to cover a couple aspects of Laudato Si'. The youth group will focus on ecological education. PPC will ask McE to be involved in setting up a calendar of events. We could provide bins for the collection of batteries, light bulbs, etc. for proper disposal.

4.2 Pastoral Plan 2023 – review of action items from previous meeting Volunteer cards need to be printed – Sue-Anne and Heather Contact other churches re. Alpha program Connect with chaplain at Immaculata.
Signs for breezeway doors – Heather will follow up.

## From Sandwich Club (sent in by Adele via email):

Sandwich Club:

- -Sandwich Club continues to provide 150 sandwiches per week for Centre 507. Will adjourn for the months of July and August, and resume in September.
- -We are in the process of looking for corporate sponsorship or funding for next year. If anyone has any leads or connections, please send them Adele's way!

- -Would it be possible to include have a weekly spot in the bulletin, looking for volunteers, and a link to the Canada Helps, so people can donate money?
- -We opened up the calendar for one in-person sandwich making event at the end of June. There was not much response, so we switched it back to a remote sandwich making week. We can revisit this idea in the fall.

From Religious Education (sent in by Adele via email):

- -Our class of 9 First Communion candidates made their First Holy Communion at Sunday masses in May. Some were asked to do the offertory procession, as a lovely way to further include them in the mass, and call them to service to their community.
- -Last Saturday was our last session, where we reflected on our First Communion, discussed Jesus' promise that he would always be with us, and we would never be alone. We also assembled 10 birthday kits for children in need. The kids were very enthusiastic about doing their part to make the world a little bit kinder, and a little bit brighter. We sang "This Little Light of Mine" and discussed how we can be a light to the world. Then we celebrated with creamsicles!
- -The birthday kits were delivered to Danielle Labelle, Early Years Outreach Worker at Centretown Community Health Centre on Wednesday June 7.
- -Baptisms: one coming up in June, another in July
- -Children's Liturgy of the Word: our last CLoW will take place June 11. We will adjourn for the summer and resume in September. Would like to resume a 3x per month schedule, if our volunteers are willing and able.
- -Lunch & Learn: our first post-covid Lunch & Learn was a screening of The Letter, a truly transformative film about Pope Francis' Encyclical Laudato Si', giving voice to the various groups that are affected by climate change: the poor, the youth, indigenous peoples, and nature itself. 8 people in attendance. Post-film discussion focussed on actions that we can take as a parish to help mitigate climate change and spread awareness of this global threat. Possible topic for next Lunch & Learn in September: "Burying the Dead, Grieving Well A guide for Catholics on Bodily Disposition." In light of the newer trends in bodily disposition (spreading ashes, human composting), some guidance from the CCCB would help parishioners make informed decisions when planning their funerals.
- -I have transitioned to full-time work at OCSB from May 15-June 30. This has posed a challenge, but I am grateful for the patience, kindness and support of our parish team. I feel that I am fully able to continue to fulfill my duties as Director of Religious Education at Canadian Martyrs, and will use my time in the summer to plan and prepare for the fall, when we resume Confirmation prep (October-November), Children's Liturgy of the Word, Lunch & Learn, and the various seasonal activities (Advent Fair, Christmas Pageant, Lenten Fair etc).
