VOCATION REFLECTION

"The Song And The Singer" by Darcie Lich, Oblate Associate, Vocation Team The internal conflict was real because it felt as though my vocation, my calling as a parent, a teacher, a Catholic school administrator, was actually what was preventing me from doing the things we used to sing about, full voice, in Sr. Chénard's class. And I would ask with a certain amount of trepidation, "Lord, when was it that I saw you hungry and gave you food, or naked and gave you clothing, or in prison and visited you?". I'd dread the answer. And I couldn't sing the song anymore. It's hard to sing when you're headed for the bench on Team Goat. But Jesus, unfailingly kind, would gently remind me. "Don't you remember? Last week, your hug fed a student who was hungry for acceptance. Yesterday, you clothed a teenager with dignity when you took the time to greet him by name with a smile in the hall. Just this morning, you sat with a youngster, imprisoned by their fear of discrimination for who they are, and spared them judgment because you simply listened with love."
