The entire Church continues its "first ever" worldwide convocation "in synod." This convocation continues through October 2024. The two great hallmarks of synodality are "attentive *listening*" and "honest *speaking*" to each other.

We know what it is to listen carefully and to speak candidly. We do this all the time in our close relationships, our families, our friendships. It's just the way we are - it's how we live!

Through this worldwide synodal process, Pope Francis is inviting us to a greater openness and a deeper commitment to listening and speaking to each other – precisely because we are faith-filled persons who share the common Christian vocation: to bring the Good News everywhere – always, by example and, now and then, by words. During the remainder of the Synod on Synodality, our parish will continue to reflect on the "art of synodal living" as the Church. We look forward to events, formation opportunities, regular bulletin reflections, and more.
