

All are invited to the Notre-Dame Cathedral, 385 Sussex Dr., on March 26 at 5pm to celebrate the Chrism Mass. The Chrism Mass is a special annual Mass where our Archdiocese gathers together to receive the new holy oils for the year. The Archbishop blesses three different oils which are then distributed to parishes:
Oil of the Sick – Used during the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick to "bring comfort and support to the

Oil of Catechumens – Used to anoint those who are to be baptized.

Sacred Chrism – "Used to anoint the newly baptized, to seal the candidates for confirmation, and to anoint the hands of presbyters and the heads of bishops at their ordination." (Ceremonial of Bishops, 274)
