VOCATION REFLECTION "Walk the Talk" by Darcie Lich, OMI Lacombe Canada Vocation Team

In the Gospel for Ascension Sunday, Jesus gives us our marching orders. For each one of us, our vocation – our 'calling' – finds its genesis in his command to "go out into all the world and proclaim the good news to the whole creation" (Mk 16:15). He's put his trust in us – we're smart and he knows we understand the assignment. But success requires follow-through, not just good intentions. And so, Paul, in the second reading, calls us to accountability when he says to us, "lead a life worthy of the calling to which you are called" (Eph 4:1). In other words, walk the talk. DAY OF RECOLLECTION


