SEASON OF CREATION 2025

"The theme of this World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation, chosen by our beloved Pope Francis, is "Seeds of Peace and Hope". On the tenth anniversary of the establishment of this Day of Prayer, which coincided with the publication of the Encyclical Laudato Si', we find ourselves celebrating the present Jubilee as "Pilgrims of Hope." This year's theme thus appears most timely. In proclaiming the Kingdom of God, Jesus often used the image of the seed. As the time of his Passion drew near, he applied that image to himself, comparing himself to the grain of wheat that must die in order to bear fruit (cf. Jn 12:24). Seeds are buried in the earth, and there, to our wonder, life springs up, even in the most unexpected places, pointing to the promise of new beginnings. We can think, for example, of flowers springing up on our roadsides from seeds that landed up there almost by chance. As those flowers grow, they brighten the gray tarmac and even manage to break through its hard surface." Read the complete message from Pope Leo for the Season of Creation here. JUBILEE YEAR HISTORIC CHURCH TOUR

On Sunday, September 14 at 1pm, you are invited to discover the Bruyère Chapel, 27 Bruyère St, followed by Notre-Dame Cathedral Basilica, 385 Sussex Dr. The Bruyère Chapel was built in 1936 for the Sisters of Charity of Ottawa. Sister Élisabeth Bruyère, spiritual daughter of Saint Marguerite d'Youville, established the order in Ottawa in 1845. This beautiful chapel has seating for 950, one of the finest acoustics in the city, and is very rarely 1846, is the oldest church in Ottawa. This Neo-Gothic church is overflowing with carvings, vivid colours, statues and rich symbolism. There will be a demonstration of the pipe organ as well as a tour of the sacristy.

Tours will be given in English and French. No registration is required and all are welcome. It is a 5-minute walk from the Bruyère Chapel to Notre-Dame.

LABYRINTH WALK

Clifford Mushquash, from Pawgwasheeng (Pays Plat First Nation) on the northshore of Gichigami (Lake Superior), will serve as our Facilitator, and John Henri Commanda (Ojibway) of the Eagle Clan and a member of Okikendawt (Dokis First Nation), as our co-facilitator. NATIONAL DAY FOR TRUTH AND RECONCILIATION

On September 30, we mark the 5th annual National Day for Truth and Reconciliation. In the lead-up to the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation, Rideau Hall will hold a special Doors Open event on September 28, from 10am to 4pm to encourage the public to reflect upon the 10 years that have passed since the release of the Truth and Reconciliation Commission's final report. On September 30, from 9am to 1pm, Rideau Hall will host a Sacred Fire led by an Indigenous fire keeper. Guided tours on that day will be specifically focused on reconciliation and the Heart Garden. Also, in honour of Orange Shirt Day and the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation, First Nations Child & Family Caring Society invites you to learn about Canada's history in the spirit of truth and reconciliation, reflect on the legacy of the residential school system, and take action. The Caring Society is pleased to partner again with Assembly of Seven Generations (A7G) and Beechwood Cemetery. They will be offering Reconciling History walking tours (registration required) and other activities to learn about the past and take action toward reconciliation.
