

WHY IS THERE A FEAST FOR THE BASILICA OF ST. JOHN LATERAN?

The feast day honouring the dedication of St. John Lateran was introduced in the 12th century and was initially celebrated only in the city of Rome. In 1726, Pope Benedict XIII ordered a worldwide commemoration of the basilica as a sign of universal Catholic unity. The feast is celebrated on **November 9** and is known today as "The Feast of the Dedication of St. John Lateran Basilica." The intent behind the annual feast day is to encourage Catholics to keep strong ties to our past and to the universal Catholic Church. Read more here.

REMEMBRANCE DAY MASS

His Excellency, the Most Reverend Scott McCaig, CC, Bishop-Ordinary of the Roman Catholic Military Ordinariate of Canada, is pleased to invite all Canadian Armed Forces members, veterans, their families, and interested members of the public to a Solemn Mass of Remembrance for the Fallen at Notre Dame Cathedral Basilica, 385 Sussex Drive. on November 11 at 8:30am. This memorial Mass is offered for the eternal rest of all persons who, throughout the generations, have died in the service of Canada in times of war, armed conflict and peace. The Cathedral Basilica's proximity to Canada's National War Memorial will allow participants the possibility of attending the National Remembrance Day Ceremony following the conclusion of the Mass. As well, immediately following the conclusion of Mass, a relic of Saint Martin of Tours will be displayed for silent veneration.
